# Department of Government and Law: Major Requirements (Updated November 2025)

### Requirements for the Major

Ten courses within the department, including:

- three of the four introductory courses (GOVT 101, 102, 103, 104);
- exposure to each of the four subfields (American Politics, International Politics, Comparative Politics, Political Theory);
- exposure beyond the introductory level to at least three of the four subfields; and
- two 400-level seminars, or one 400-level seminar and an honors thesis.

#### Notes:

- 1) Some courses are designated as providing exposure toward more than one subfield. To fulfill the breadth requirement, students who take a course designated as satisfying two subfields can count that course toward either of the identified subfields, but not toward both.
- 2) Because all upper-level political theory courses require Introduction to Political Theory as a prerequisite, majors should plan to take GOVT 104.
